The theme is Christmas Carols and students will be joining together in grade groups to perform for our school community.</li> <li>Dec. 21st – Santa Breakfast</li> </ul> <p>Other...</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>School Cash Online</li> </ul> <p>We will be introducing the School Cash Online payment system to our school community in January, 2019 as an easy and safe way to pay for school fees. Parents will be able to make payments for field trips, school events, planners etc. using eCheck, myWallet and credit</p>	

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	<p>card.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Starfishpack.com</li> </ul> <p>Through discussions with Riverdale Elementary, our sister school in North Surrey, I was made aware of the following program that has just been implemented in this school community. Is this an initiative that we can support as a school moving forward?</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>o Starfish Packs, which provides two breakfasts, two lunches, two dinners and snacks for local vulnerable children to take home every weekend, is 100% community funded and staffed. With no paid staff and no government funding, the program relies entirely on local community support for both funding and volunteers.</li> <li>o What started in a single school in Abbotsford in the spring of 2013 has grown to over a dozen BC communities. Starfish Packs will be delivered this school year in Abbotsford, Surrey, Chilliwack, Delta, Aldergrove, Langley, Mission, Coquitlam, Maple Ridge, Pitt Meadows, Port Coquitlam, Vernon and Williams Lake. All local donations remain in the communities where they are made.</li> <li>o In Surrey, we are aware of the existence of breakfast and lunch program in many schools. Research indicates that 13,000 Surrey residents – 41% of whom are children – turn to food banks to meet the basic human need for food security. The social costs of food insecurity are high, with lost economic productivity, poorer educational outcomes, and erosion of dignity for these Surrey residents. Surrey has “11 of the 20 poorest neighborhoods in BC. 40.5% of residents in Guildford and 42.7% of residents in Newton report annual household incomes under \$40,000. Lone parent households are particularly challenged with regard to accessing affordable food, and one in four experiences disrupted food intake and eating patterns.</li> <li>o At a cost of \$525 per child for the whole school year, the program only spends \$12-\$15 per week to provide six meals in each weekly backpack. Working with the local grocer, Starfish Packs is maximizing every single donated dollar and working towards its mandate to change the world, one child at a time.</li> </ul> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Crescent Park Annex Painting</li> </ul> <p>In October I was approached by the widow of local artist Vojislav Morosan. Morosan painted many pictures of buildings and landscape scenes in the lower mainland including one of the Crescent Park Annex in 2001. His widow has offered to sell this painting to our school for \$900.
